Hardships include economic impact on farmers' markets and food producer and food processor livelihoods alike, farm infrastructure and livestock, in addition to the emotional toil from evacuations and other losses as a result of this forest fire emergency.

The community of farmers' markets, farmers, food processors, artisans and all of our loyal customers care deeply about the wellbeing of all of those affected. Our hearts and minds are with you.

- 1. If your farmers' market is closed, has moved location or changed operating hours due to the forest fires, please send us an email. This will help us understand the scope of impact from forest fires among our members.
- 2. Vendors of all kinds are being negatively affected, both personally and economically. We encourage farmers' markets outside of forest fire areas to open their hearts and markets and offer temporary space to vendors who have been evacuated and displaced to other communities this season. A soggy spring and now forest fires have made this a challenging farmers' market season. Let's continue to support each other wherever possible.
