About the Richmond Agricultural and Industrial Society

The Richmond Agricultural and Industrial Society (RAIS) was originally formed in 1891 by a group of Steveston farmers and merchants, many of whom were also Richmond's founders. The RAIS was re-established in 1965 and continues today as one of the oldest societies in BC. The RAIS is governed by a volunteer board of directors; its members are the same directors as the Steveston Community Society.
